AMERICAN MASTERS: LITTLE RICHARD: THE KING AND QUEEN OF ROCK AND ROLL — Experience the meteoric rise and enduring legacy of Little Richard. This portrait of the "King and Queen of Rock and Roll" explores his far-reaching influence as well as his advocacy for the rights of Black artists in the music industry.

PACIFIC HEARTBEAT: BORN THIS WAY: AWA'S STORY/ THE ROGERS — *Awa's Story* chronicles an openly transgender teen as she attends her final year at college in Wellington, New Zealand. In *The Rogers*, the first visible group of transgender men in the Pacific Islands is formed.

OUT IN RURAL AMERICA — The film follows five stories from the LGBTQ+ community over six years, digging into issues of self-doubt, discrimination, acceptance, and small-town and Midwestern LGBTQ+ life from a cultural, social, familial, and religious perspective.

AMERICAN EXPERIENCE: STONEWALL UPRISING — On June 28, 1969, police raided the Stonewall Inn, a gay bar in New York City. In response, the streets erupted into violent protests that lasted for six days, marking a major turning point in the modern gay civil rights movement.

AMERICAN MASTERS: JOE PAPP IN FIVE ACTS — Joe Papp was the founder of The Public Theater, Free Shakespeare in the Park, and producer of groundbreaking plays like "Hair," "A Chorus Line," and "For Colored Girls". He created a "theater of inclusion" based on the belief that great art is for everyone.

POV: CALL HER GANDA — When Jennifer Laude, a Filipina trans woman, is brutally murdered by a U.S. Marine, three women stage a political uprising, pursuing justice and taking on hardened histories of U.S. imperialism.

PRIDELAND — Actor Dyllón Burnside journeys across the American South, meeting diverse members of the LGBTQ+ community — from a lesbian rodeo champ in Texas to an African American mayor ally in Alabama. WE'LL MEET AGAIN: COMING OUT — Before the 1970s, coming out meant risking everything. In this episode, host Ann Curry tells the story of two young New England men as they reconnect with those who helped them discover and accept their sexuality.

POV: OUT IN THE NIGHT — In New York City, a group of African-American lesbians were violently threatened by a man on the street. The women fought back and were later charged with gang assault and attempted murder. The documentary examines the sensational case and the women's battle, revealing the role that race, gender identity, and sexuality play in the criminal justice system.

AMERICAN EXPERIENCE: CASA SUSANNA — In the 1950s and '60s, an underground network of transgender women and cross-dressing men found refuge at a modest house in the Catskills region of New York, known as Casa Susanna. Told through the memories of those who visited the house, the film provides a moving look back at a secret world where the persecuted and frightened found freedom, acceptance, and, often, the courage to live out of the shadows.

AMERICAN MASTERS: JAMES BALDWIN: THE PRICE OF THE

TICKET — This program is an in-depth portrait of James Baldwin, one of the greatest American authors of the 20th century. Using archival material that reflects Baldwin's worldwide influence and appeal, the film includes interviews with family members, friends, and notable colleagues, including Maya Angelou, Toni Morrison, William Styron, Amiri Baraka, Richard Avedon, and Bobby Short, among others.

As they grew older, they supported each other as they both came out as transgender.
