Though the run finishes, Brent's fight never stops.

"L.A.: A Queer History" sheds light on historical figures who are largely unacknowledged, creating a newfound dialogue about LGBTQ history.

OUT IN RURAL AMERICA

The documentary follows five stories from the LGBTQ+ community over six years, exploring the challenges and joys of being queer in rural America. It delves into themes of self-doubt, discrimination, acceptance, and LGBTQ+ life in small-town and Midwestern settings from various perspectives.
